When reporting studies (prospective or retrospective) involving people, medical records, or human tissues, authors should indicate whether the procedures followed were in accordance with the ethical standards of the responsible committee on human experimentation (institutional and national) and with the Helsinki Declaration of 1975 (revised in 2013). Authors should also declare that any research involving people, medical records, and human tissues was approved by the relevant institutional review boards or ethics committees and that all human participants gave written informed consent. Information regarding this approval specifically needs to be mentioned in the article text.

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
